COLORECTAL CANCER SIGNS + SYMPTOMS

-  **Blood in your stool**, bleeding from the rectum, and/or change in the appearance of the stool
-  **Change in bowel habits** or blood in the toilet after having a bowel movement
-  **Unexplained Fatigue** or Weakness
-  **Anemia**
-  Unexplained or **Unintentional Weight Loss**
-  **Persistent Cramps or Low Back Pain**, cramping pain in the lower stomach
-  **Feeling Bloating**, or a feeling of discomfort or an urge to have a bowel movement when there is no need to have one
-  Sometimes colorectal cancer presents with **no symptoms at all**

Colon cancer symptoms can be confusing. Stomach ailments or a change in bowel habits are common. They don't always mean that you have a serious condition such as colorectal cancer.
